Using volunteer labor and tax-deductible donations of money and materials, Habitat builds homes in partnership with these future homeowner families.

- A total of 17 Coweta County families currently hold approved applications for Habitat homes
- The NCHFH goal is to build or renovate 6-10 homes annually

Newnan-Coweta Habitat for Humanity (NCHFH)

Investing in our community!

MISSION: Newnan-Coweta Habitat for Humanity (NCHFH) is a self-help homeownership organization that works in partnership with low income families to provide safe, decent, affordable houses and create stable communities in Coweta County. The vision of NCHFH is to mobilize and collaborate our community to improve the quality of life for others through affordable homeownership by following the Christian principles of giving and serving others.

Who is served by Habitat?

Families are selected to partner with NCHFH to build their homes based on three criteria:

- **Ability to pay** - Total long-term debt/income ratio 35-40%, recent verifiable on-time rent payment history, and ability to make \$900 escrow down payment before closing on home
- **Willingness to partner** – Mandatory Homeowner Orientation, no judgments, liens, or bankruptcy within the last 12 months, work out 18-month payment plan for outstanding collections with no judgments, performs required sweat equity hours, and attend Family Support educational workshops in home management and home maintenance skills
- **Need for housing** – Home visits conducted to evaluate housing needs and current housing conditions of residents living in Coweta County or city limits of Brooks, Fayetteville, Peachtree City, or Tyrone for one year prior to application
